1. Sheep (People)-

- We as people are the sheep in this story.
- Being called a sheep is so appropriate, as sheep do not get chased; they get led, sometimes individually, sometimes as a group.
- In the same way sheep follow a shepherd, those who are Christ's, follow him.
- Sheep sometimes wonder off, and find themselves lost.

2. Wolf (Devil)

- Seeks to destroy the flock.
- The reason Satan wants to destroy the flock, is not because he loves the flock and wants them for his own, but rather he wants them for his own because he wants to destroy our savior by hurting those he loves.

3. Hired Hand (Perceived Saviours)-

- The hired hand in the story is something in our life that appears to be our savior, it makes us happy for a while, but when things get tough, they are gone.
- This could be money, family, friends, spouse etc....

4. Good Shepherd (Real Savior)-

- Jesus is the true savior; circumstances do not change his love for us.
- He will never abandon us.
- No one has power over him, and he chose to lay his life down to save us, the sheep. Nothing could make him abandon us.
- His sacrifice allowed us to experience his grace and mercy.
- He not only laid his life down for us, but rose from the dead!
- He owns us, even though that can sound bad it is the best news ever! He is not just here because he gets a paycheck like a hired hand. He has invested his life for us! He will never let us go!
