DONOVAN 'BAD BOY' SMITH

How many club DJs can claim to have started out in 1977 and still be at the cutting edge of their profession? Not many, but one who can only lives up the road in Gloucester - Donovan "Bad Boy" Smith. His career sounds like a history of UK underground dance music (soul, reggae, hip-hop, house, garage, hardcore he's played them all at one time or another) but it is with jungle he has made his name.

Donovan's conversion to something resembling the current scene was in the mid-eighties when he met the now legendary Bristol collective the Wild Bunch (who at the time comprised of Massive Attack member Daddy G and Soul II Soul & Bjork producer Nellee Hooper. "As soon as I met the Wild Bunch and saw them scratching, that just freaked me out!", says Donovan. "And when their MCs came along! That was the first time I'd seen a DJ with an MC with him. Before it was just the DJ talking over the mic introducing the records and I thought "yes, I want some of that!"

The other major influence was hearing DJs like Jack Frost, Brian G and Carl Cox playing old school rave and hardcore at the Brunel Rooms in Swindon playing "ruff reggae and soul" at the beginning of the nineties. "They used to mix in the odd track with reggae into it and I saw the response and thought "I want some of that as well!", explains Donovan. Some might see this as opportunism, but nobody could survive jumping on the latest bandwagon this long without a genuine love of all music and to this day he still listens and DJs other music.

He describes his style as drum & bass / strings, stating Roni Size, LTJ Bukem and Goldie as influences, but quickly adds that it also depends the kind of crowds he is in front of. Donovan is possibly one of the most under-rated DJs around. although he has a reasonably "big" name, it would definitely be bigger if he came from London or had moved there. This, however, is out of the question. "No disrespect to London, but I'm happy where I am. I've always moaned about Gloucester not having a scene, but there is a good scene growing thirty miles down the road in Bristol."

Although he has made tracks for Basement Records during the last couple of years, it is only recently that he feels he has achieved what he really wants. "The first stuff I did was happy hardcore, because that was the Basement sound and what I was hearing. I always wanted to do a drum and bass track but this is the first time I've managed to make one with some originality." Untitled as yet, expect it to be released on Basement in February.

Like so many other DJs, it is in this area where he sees his future and therefore wants to spend more time in the studio, whether recording, re-mixing or producing: "I want to concentrate more on making music, which I've always wanted to do, but I've only just started to get access to it. Studios are very rare in Gloucester and you've got to travel a long way."

What else is there left for him to do in 1995? If you live in or around the London area, listen up for a Donovan Smith show on the appropriately named Don FM. After a successful month's trial, it has been granted a licence and will be broadcasting from next February. There are loose plans for other radio shows in the south west and, away from jungle, an interesting idea for a show which is a "big aim" for the New Year which shows his versatility: "I'd love to do a nice midnight to 4am spot on any radio station playing some of my old soul tunes - a wind down session." 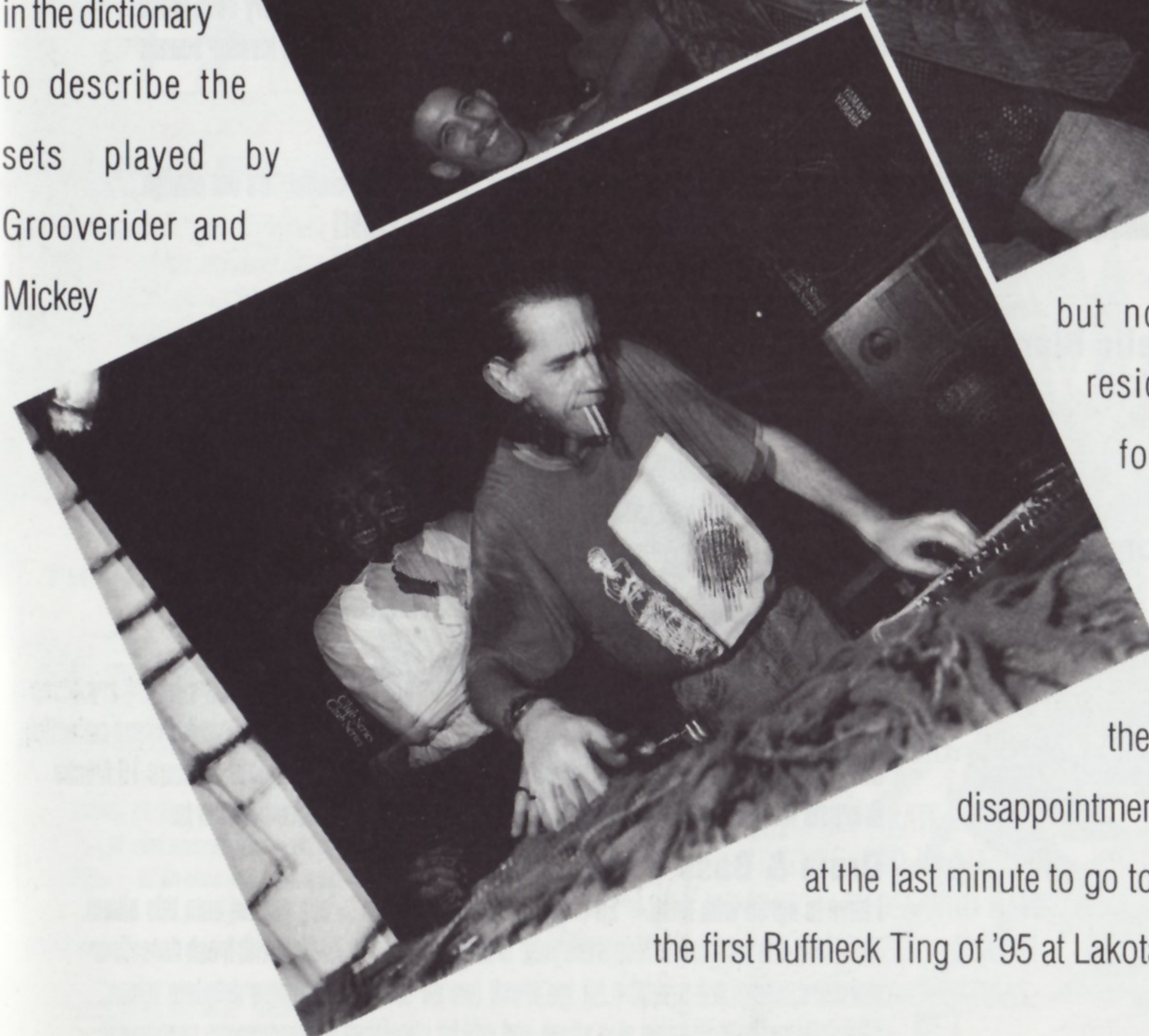
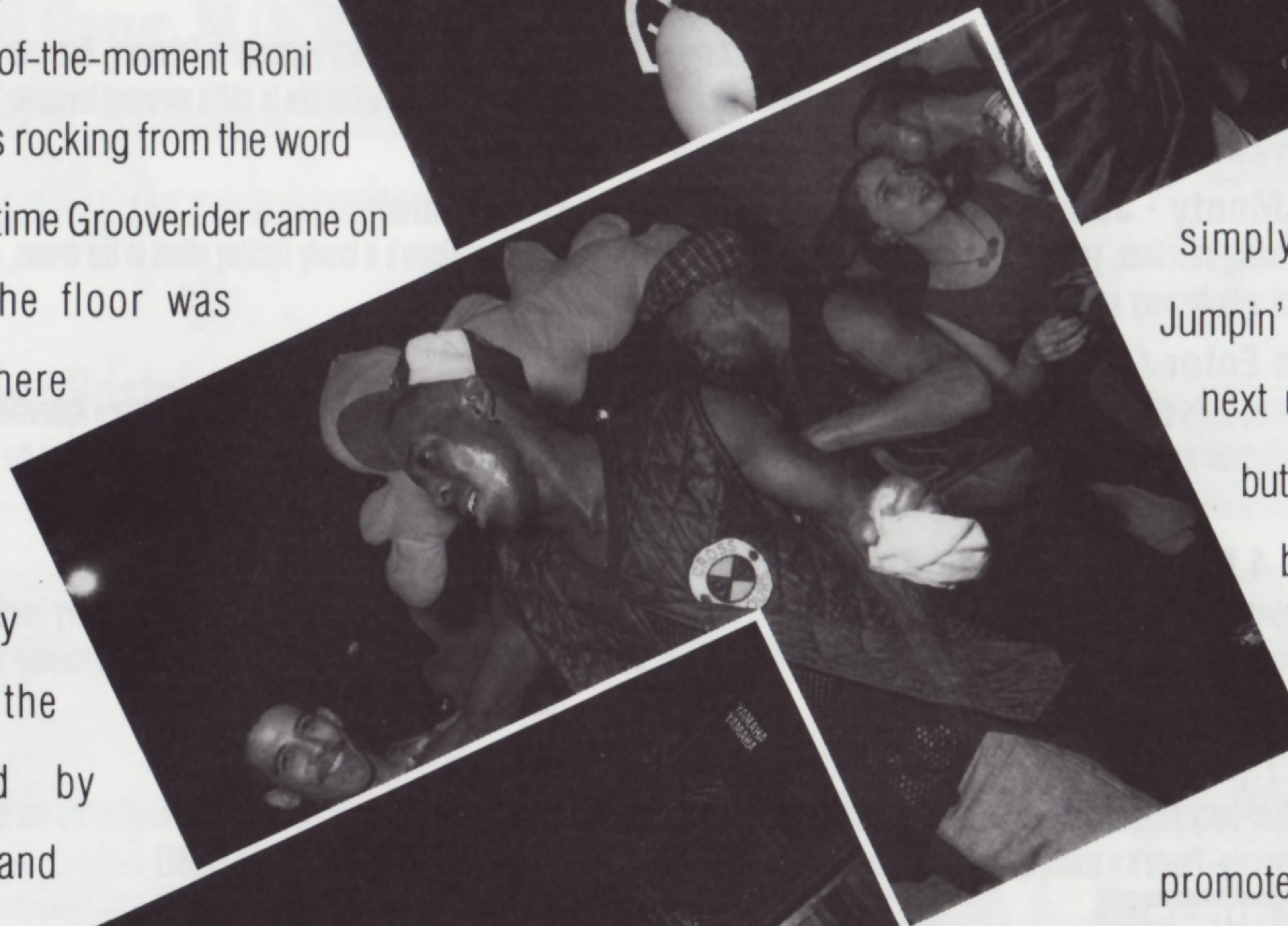
This brings me neatly onto the next requirement if you want to go "flying" (the phrase used by these sad characters.) It really helps if you're a wannabe.

Ruffneck Ting have been responsible for some of best parties in Bristol throughout '94, so it was fitting that their last event of the year at New Trinity on December 10 was the biggest too. Fifteen hundred people came through the doors in total, and the wise ones came early and stayed til the finish. Bristol's man-of-the-moment Roni Size got things rocking from the word go and by the time Grooverider came on (10.30pm) the floor was moving. There aren't enough superlatives in the dictionary to describe the sets played by Grooverider and Mickey

REVIEWS

? - Right Bullet (Kik Man)

With an intro of crisp beats, picochet gunshots and stabs of "right bullet", it's a joy to mix. There's also an effective drop into booming bass, furious drums and hissing cymbals. Strange discordant strings come later. Definitely a hit on the dancefloor.

DJ Massive - Dancehall Massive EP

Of the three tracks featured, Runcome is my favourite. It's quite simple, with a "bwoy" bassline and a dark low bass alternating underneath lively drums. A catchy ragga "Run come follow me" sample and trumpets gives it instant appeal.

The New Cru featuring General Pecos - Runcome (Labello Blanco)

They've been teasing us with this one for a while but at last it's no longer exclusive to dubplate and compilation. Fully released in February, Runcome is an absolute smasher. Bizzy B and Ruffkuts "Hardstep" mix is a treat for those who like it booming and hard. The original mix is still a personal favourite - that swinging rhythm does it for me every time!

Rude Bwoy Monty - Jungle Man / Out in Da Streets (Frontline)

Out in Da Streets is totally infectious, you'll be singing "sometimes I wanna give in..." everywhere. There's a lovely flicking effect to the drums, more contagious vocals and with it's sexy sub-bass, is irresistibly danceable.

Alladin - We Enter / So Good (remixes) (Aphrodite)

Powerful bass and rattling beats burst out of a big choral intro. We Enter is another dramatic piece of musicianship from master producers Aphrodite. It's guaranteed to keep a dancefloor rocking. So Good also has loads of energy with a funky bass, big drum rolls and crashing cymbals. Watch out for the remix of Boo Ya coming soon.

Smokey Joe - 4 Meg Sound Boy / Shining (remix) (Labello Blanco)

The remix of Shining sounds brilliantly produced with a beautiful, deep dub reggae feel to it. Sharp breakbeats answer each other over heavy bass while spacey sounds, harmonica and timestretched vocals wash in and out. Moving stuff. Sound Boy also oozes dub and with ruff beats & space invader sounds which drop into a wonderful reggae bassline.

Orca - ? (Lucky Spin)

Another tasty little number from those tasty Bristol boys. Lovely crisp beats with aquatic chimey noises lead to soulful "it's not enough..." vocals. There's a stunning "why" sample on the other side - beefed up a bit, I reckon this one could be LARGE!

ALBUMS

Jungle Massive 2 (Labello Blanco)



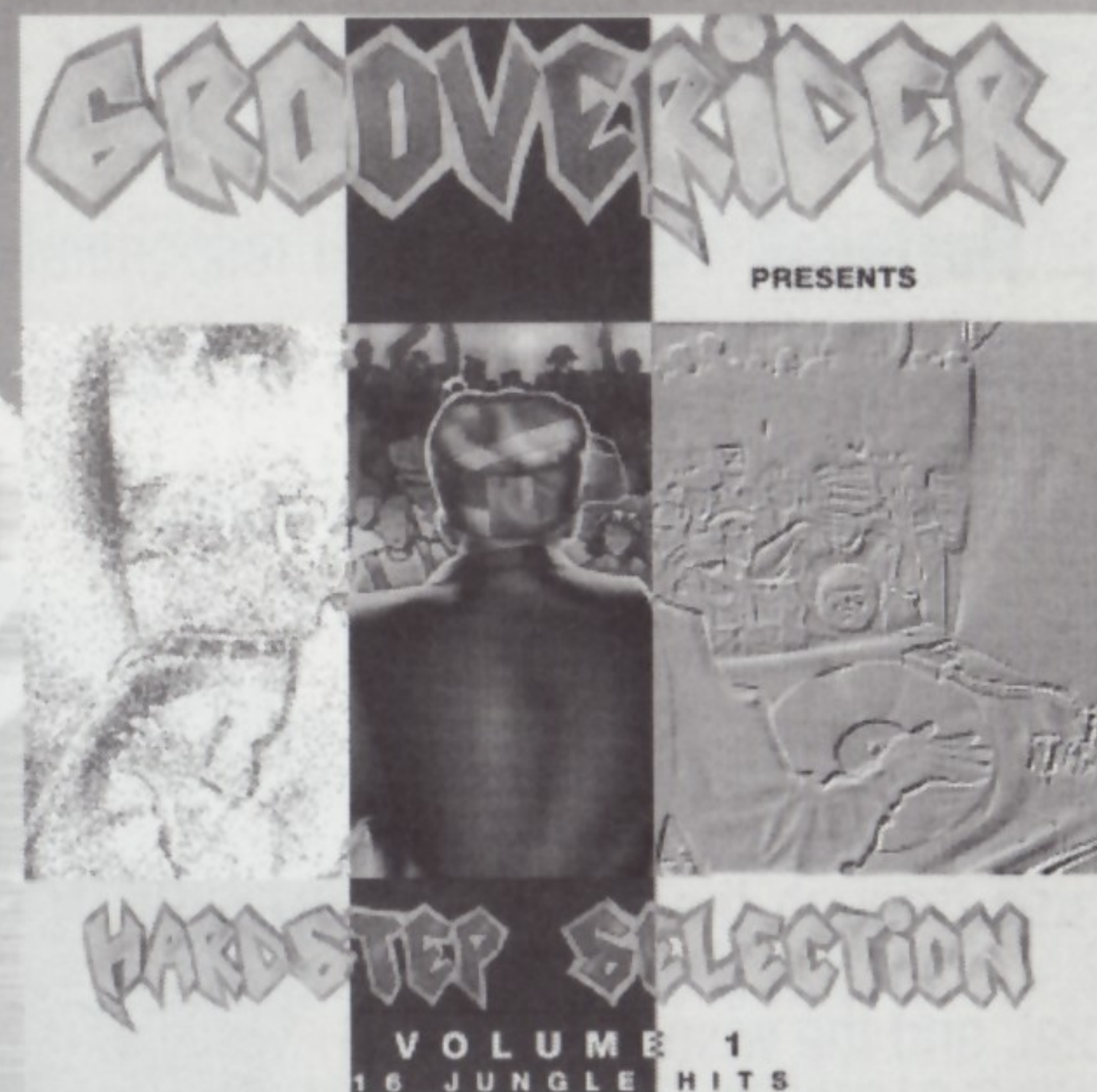
This is one of the best jungle compilations to date. A selection of big tunes covering the wide spectrum of what is termed "jungle". From Demolition Man to Nookie, 16 tracks in all (with 4 extra on Gachet's mix tape) by loads of top artists. It's good to see so many quality tunes representing jungle at a commercial level, but it's a shame some of the tracks haven't been released as singles yet.

Grooverider presents the Hardstep Selection (Kickin')

This album is doing it properly. Tunes that have been big on the dancefloors in '94 are given extended life and brought to a wider audience through Grooverider's selection. A diverse collection, there's less ragga than most compilations and lots of quality drum & bass. There's 16 tracks & artists include LTJ Bukem, Tom & Jerry and Dittinger. A pleasure to listen to.

Drum & Bass 3 (Breakdown)

I have to agree with them - "20 of jungle's ruffest rhythms" - are packed onto this album. This is the one you have to hide when your mates come round. Loaded with fresh dancefloor stormers, some are maybe a bit too fresh (we're talking "exclusive dubplate mixes" again.) However, it is a five star album and will be cherished by anyone who acquires it.
