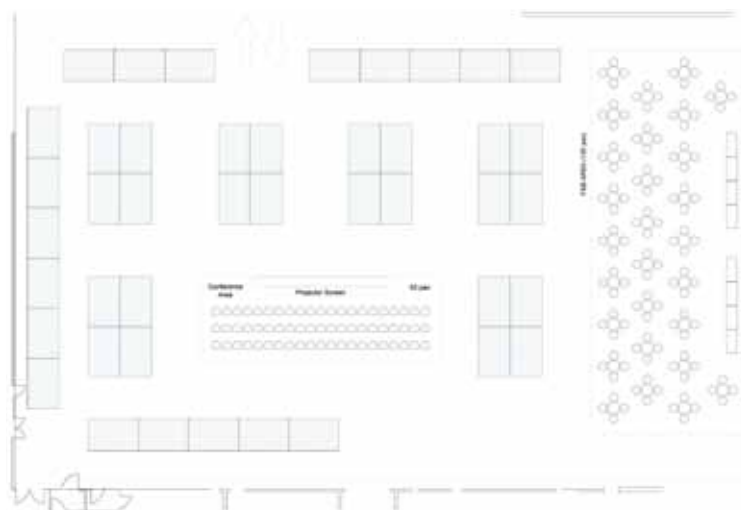

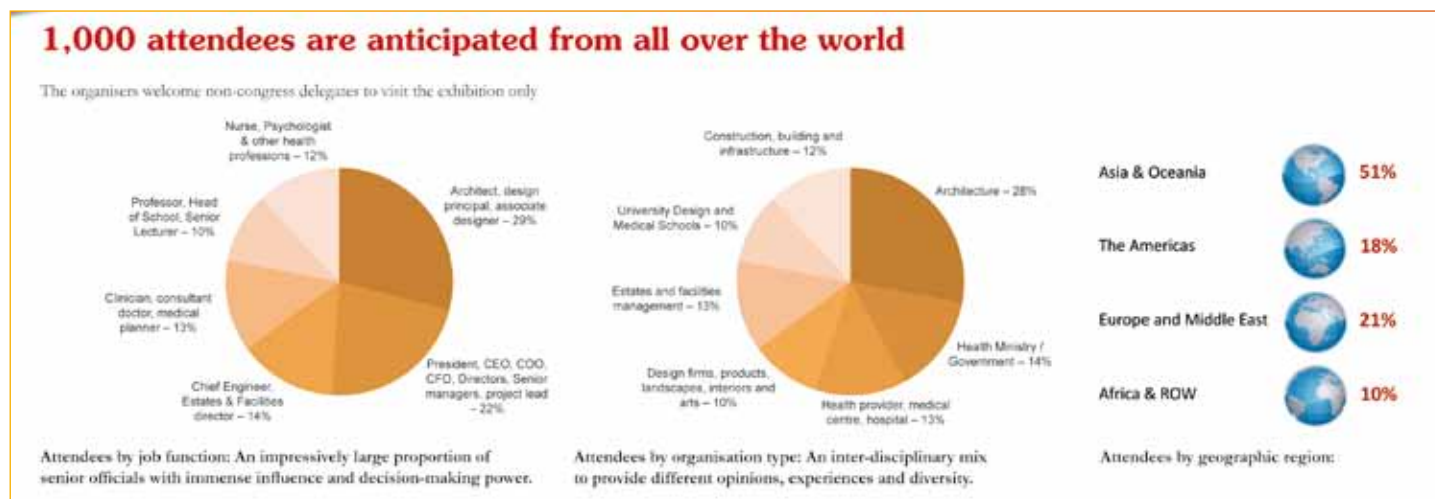
Exhibition floor plan at Kuala Lumpur Convention Centre
